*Reimagined Fall Fundraising Event to Blend Design Inspiration with
Curated Collection of Interior Decor, Antiques, Vintage Fashion & More*

WINNETKA, IL, July 20, 2026 – The Community House Woman's Board is proud to announce the premiere of **The Winnetka Edit**, a two-day fundraising event that is the newest iteration of the former Antiques+Modernism Show. The new event will kick off on Friday evening, November 6 with an Opening Night Party from 6:30 PM – 9:30 PM including advanced access to shopping plus hors d'oeuvres, signature cocktails, a full bar and live entertainment. The following day, Saturday, November 7th, from 10 AM – 5 PM, guests will enjoy a full day of inspiration including coveted speakers and continued viewing and shopping of interior décor, home accessories and vintage fashion.

The Winnetka Edit is a fundraiser for and will be held at the Community House, an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that first opened its doors in 1911 and offers sports, fitness, performing arts, and educational programs for all ages, along with gatherings and special events that bring people together across Winnetka and its neighboring communities.

The Winnetka Edit is being produced by a committee of Woman's Board members, chaired by Winnetka residents Laura Senner and Sharokina Pazand, who are sourcing a mix of unique and highly desired decor, furniture, vintage fashion and artwork through a carefully curated selection of dealers, retailers, and vintage experts. In addition, the event's Designer Showcase will feature five Northshore based interior designers including Sarah Vaile Design, Liz Aibel Sherwood of White Couch Design, Jen Marie Interiors, Emily Sturgess Design and Lauren Buxbaum Gordon who will showcase their respective styles and sell and display their products while educating and inspiring attendees.

The Opening Night Party titled "A Night at the Estate" will take place Friday November 6 from 6 PM – 9 PM. This elevated evening will feature exceptional food, live entertainment, signature experiences, and a first look at the weekend's curated shopping event. Tickets for this kickoff event are \$200 and will go on sale September 17 on the Community House website.

"Creating community has been at the heart of our mission since 1911," said Amy Skalinder, President & CEO of the Community House. "We're very excited to continue honoring this tradition by introducing The Winnetka Edit this fall at the

Community House. The Winnetka Edit will build on the success and heritage of our iconic Antiques+Modernism Show by retaining the spirit of that historic show while evolving the format and mix of exhibitors to better reflect today's tastes and interests."
